On behalf of a new community group called Roseau Outdoor Adventures & Recreation, we'd like to take this opportunity to inform you of some exciting changes we hope will happen in the next few months. A stakeholder group has been organized to work on getting the Roseau River on the Minnesota Water Trails map. As a local group that utilizes the river, we've been asked to participate and provide feedback to ensure community support for this project. Having the Roseau River designated as a mapped state water trail would increase the use of the River from the Canadian Border to Hayes Lake State Park and the South branch to Wannaska. The Roseau River Watershed District has already secured grant money for project planning and also a kayak dock to be installed at Roseau City Park to kick-off this adventure!

The stakeholders group consists of local DNR officials, Roseau River Watershed District, Life Care Medical Center, Historical Society, City of Roseau, Roseau County, U of M Extension, Explore Minnesota, Roseau County 4-H, Roseau County Trail Blazers, and Roseau Outdoor Adventures & Recreation. One of our goals is to promote the Roseau River as a trail of regional significance in Northwest Minnesota. Water trails connect individuals, families, and groups with a variety of hiking trails, bikeways, museums, historic sites, parks, and public lands. They cultivate a sense of place and love of the community.


